We are Honest...We Don't Cover up the Truth.

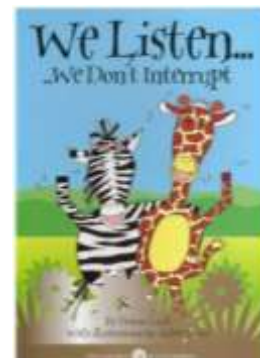
We Work Hard...We Do Not Waste Time.

Easy recipe

Goey-in-the-middle Chocolate Puds

These gooey gorgeous puds have been on Jo Seagar's TV show and are a wonderful treat to cuddle up with on a cold winter night.

I really like her no-fuss, simple recipes. Serve these delicious puddings with softly whipped cream, thick yoghurt or ice-cream.



Ingredients

400g dark chocolate, chopped
50g butter
3/4 cup caster sugar
4 eggs
2 tablespoons of flour

Method

Pre-heat oven to 180 degrees Celsius

Spray 6 cup sized ramekins or oven proof coffee cups with non-stick baking spray.

Melt the chocolate either in a bowl over a saucepan of simmering water, or microwave in short bursts on medium heat, stirring well until melted and smooth.

With an electric mixer, beat butter and sugar together until pale and creamy. Add the eggs, then the melted chocolate and the flour. Mix until well combined.

Divide the mixture between the prepared ramekins.

Place the ramekins on an oven tray for ease of handling. Bake for 18-20 minutes.

Puddings should be glossy and smooth on top, like a brownie, but soft and gooey in the center. Don't overcook!!
